Nomen's Schedule

Vugraph

The 2012 USWBC will be covered on BBO Vugraph starting with the Semi-finals. We hope to cover all 4 tables in play in the Semi-finals and both tables in the Finals. To watch the Vugraph online, go to the BBO website where you can either log on directly from your browser, go to "Vugraph" and choose which table to watch, or download the BBO software to run BBO on your computer. If you choose the latter approach, after downloading, install the software on your computer, log on, follow the directions to become a BBO member and you'll be magically transported to the Lobby of the largest bridge club in the world. Click on the button labeled VUGRAPH and you'll be able to choose which of the matches you want to watch.

There will often be a "yellow" user on BBO called USBF. If you have general questions, please ask USBF, not one of the hard-working Vugraph Operators, some of whom may not have time to respond to private messages. Thank you.

Each day's schedule is the same (these are Chicago times; to see the times for your time-zone, go to the **BBO Vugraph schedule site**)

10:30-12:45 1:00-3:15 5:15-7:30 7:45-10:00

All of the teams will play the same boards, but for security reasons, if one match is sufficiently behind that we have to start it later than the other one, we will not start the Vugraph broadcast until both matches have started play.

After a session, you can review the Vugraph action on our Web Vugraphs, which show each hand played with a link to bidding and play records. Take a look at the events currently available to see what we'll have for the 2012 USWBC. Web Vugraphs are posted within about half an hour of completion of the Vugraph show.


There are 7 teams in the Round Robin. Teams will be numbered in Seeding Point order.

Order of Play on June 2nd is opposite to that on June 1st.

EVERY PLAYER ON EACH TEAM MUST PLAY AGAINST EACH OTHER TEAM

Last two matches on June 2nd are segregated, no comparisons, no substitutions in closed room. Because this means there can be no seating rights for those matches, there are no seating rights in the first two matches on June 1st.



Lunch on Tuesday through Thursday from 2:30 - 5:30.


On Friday, Saturday & Sunday lunch will be a buffet in the hotel restaurant (Fresh 1800 on the lobby level).

We will give each captain coupons for the buffet at the Captains' Meeting on Friday morning. If you find you need additional coupons, they will be available.


The Hospitality Suite will be open for Vugraph, casual chit chat, drinks & snacks during the rest of the playing hours and for a short time after the end of play each day.

Bidding on this hand got Stansby off to the right lead. He led the club ace and bought a look at dummy. Bramley signaled with the club deuce.

Stansby could see the ace/king of hearts so he switched to the diamond king and diamond to Bramley's ace. Bramley gave his partner a ruff and the contract was down one before declarer gained the lead!

The favorable diamond position allowed four spades to make at all tables where the defenders did not get an immediate ruff.

Bramley/Stansby bid a vulnerable 20 point game. They were speeding and got lucky when their opponents did not discover it in time.

Edgar led the spade ace. Stansby falsecarded, dropping the ten. Edgar switched to the club king. Stansby won the ace and ruffed a club in hand.

He led a heart toward the queen/ten. When the ace popped on his left, he was home free.

Had North switched to a diamond instead of a club, he could have defeated the contract two tricks.

He could win his heart ace and give South a diamond ruff. South could underlead his spade kind to North's queen, and North could give South a second ruff for down two.

Making four spades earned Bramley/Stansby 8 IMPs.



For Your Information: I-294/I-90 Tri-Level Bridge Project

The Tri-Level Bridge Project is reconstructing the flyover ramp bridge structures carrying traffic from the Tri-State Tollway (I-294) to the Jane Addams Memorial Tollway (I-90). The two-year project is scheduled to be complete by fall 2012. In 2012, the ramp bridge carrying northbound I-294 traffic to westbound I-90 will be reconstructed.

Construction Update (03-28-2012)

The ramp carrying traffic from eastbound I-190 to westbound I-90 and the ramp carrying traffic from northbound I-294 to westbound I-90 are closed. A detour will be in place through early July 2012.

Detour Route:

Northbound I-294 traffic is routed through the cash side of the Touhy Toll Plaza, exit at Touhy Avenue West, turning right at River Road and immediately re-entering I-294 southbound to reach the exit ramp to westbound I-90.

Eastbound I-190 traffic is directed to northbound I-294 to follow the same detour route via Touhy Avenue.

No Double Tolls Charged

The detour route takes drivers through a second toll plaza, but customers will not be charged twice. I-PASS customers should go through the I-PASS Only lane at the Touhy Toll Plaza and at the Devon Toll Plaza. Only the 75 cent toll at the Devon Toll Plaza will be posted to I-PASS accounts.

Cash-paying customers should use the lane identified by overhead detour signage, located to the right of the I-PASS Only lane. Customers must request a receipt to avoid a double toll on the detour route. Passenger cars will be charged the \$1.50 Devon toll rate at the Touhy Toll Plaza in the detour lane only. A receipt will be provided which must be presented at the Devon Toll Plaza to avoid a double toll.







Mandell led the ace of hearts and, on seeing the jack, switched to the ten of diamonds. DeFotis ducked in dummy and Sorkin won his king. Sorkin shifted to a small club, won in dummy with the ace. DeFotis continued with clubs, Sorkin rising with the queen. DeFotis ruffed Sorkin's heart return in hand, ruffed a club in dummy, played a spade to the ace and ruffed his last club with the trump queen. He played a

spade to the ten, successfully finessing against Sorkin's jack. He cashed the king of spades and led his last spade. Mandell couldn't part with his heart king or the queen in dummy would turn good. Dutifully, he pitched a diamond, coming down to the heart king and the diamond nine.

DeFotis had reached the crossroads. He pitched the heart from dummy and led a small diamond to the ace, felling the nine and the queen, and making his contract. Play This Hand ...

 Burke Snowden, a member of the USBF Under-21 Team, sat South on this hand and was faced with the following problem from a Sectional Swiss Team event.
- **♥** 53

2 NV vs. Vul, Burke opened 1NT and reached 3NT on an unimpeded auction. You take the reins.



The opening lead was the HJ, and it went 3, 6, to you. The opponents are playing upside down count and attitude. How would you play?

At the other table declarer opened a strong club and reached the same contract, again with no opposition bidding. The lead was the same. Would the lack of interference cause you to play differently?

- A42
- KQ7
 AQ942
 If hearts are 5-3, you need either a singleton ace of clubs on your left or the protected ace of clubs on your left combined with a singleton king of spades in either hand. If this is the case you simply win the heart and drive out the ace of clubs.
- ▲ J3

If hearts are 4-4 and the lead is from AJTx, you need either player to hold the singleton ace of clubs, or you need LHO to hold both the ace of clubs and the king of spades, or you need a singleton king of spades in either opponent's hand.

As above, you simply win the heart and drive out the ace of clubs. This play also works if the opening leader holds JT42 and RHO has played the 6 from A986 in an effort to keep communications open. This play would be an error if the opening leader held KJTx(x). There is also the chance that when hearts are 4-4, LHO can make the mistake of winning the ace of clubs and trying to cash the ace of hearts. Ideally, RHO should be giving count on the opening lead to prevent this type of error.

If hearts are 6-2 and the lead is from AJTxxx, you can play for RHO to hold either the singleton ace of clubs or both the protected ace of clubs and king of spades (or the king of spades is singleton). In this case you must duck the opening heart lead to sever communications. On the other hand, if LHO holds the singleton ace of clubs with six hearts, you must win the first trick.

A 4-4 break is substantially more likely than the 6-2 break. LHO will hold four hearts 33% of the time and will hold six hearts only 8.5% of the time. The hand makes on only a little over 30% (either both black honors with LHO or a singleton ace of clubs) of the 4-4 breaks. On the surface, the 6-2 breaks also require the same favorable black honor distribution. However we can probably assume that LHO did not pass throughout with a good six card heart suit and both black honors. Factoring this into our calculations, the pure mathematical analysis would favor playing for the 4-4 break (about a 10% chance) rather than the 6-2 position (about a 5% chance).

When this problem was given to Ralph Katz, 1/6 of the team representing the USA in Lille, France, in the Bermuda Bowl, without any analysis or discussion, his immediate first reaction was to play for the 6-2 break. Ralph hypothesized that the lack of opponent bidding suggests that the hand will make on nearly 100% of the 6-2 breaks.

This is especially true over a strong, artificial 1C opening, where almost all players would venture a bid with AJTxxx and a side honor. Even over a strong NT opener, most modern players bid on these hands.

Ralph also noted that the opening leader might well lead a different four card suit if he has only four hearts.

Ralph's analysis was indeed correct. LHO had six hearts and RHO had both black honors.
