Women's Schedule

Vugraph

The 2012 USWBC will be covered on BBO Vugraph starting with the Semi-finals. We hope to cover all 4 tables in play in the Semi-finals and both tables in the Finals. To watch the Vugraph online, go to the BBO website where you can either log on directly from your browser, go to "Vugraph" and choose which table to watch, or download the BBO software to run BBO on your computer. If you choose the latter approach, after downloading, install the software on your computer, log on, follow the directions to become a BBO member and you'll be magically transported to the Lobby of the largest bridge club in the world. Click on the button labeled VUGRAPH and you'll be able to choose which of the matches you want to watch.

There will often be a "yellow" user on BBO called USBF. If you have general questions, please ask USBF, not one of the hard-working Vugraph Operators, some of whom may not have time to respond to private messages. Thank you.

Each day's schedule is the same (these are Chicago times; to see the times for your time-zone, go to the **BBO Vugraph schedule site**)

10:30-12:45 1:00-3:15 5:15-7:30 7:45-10:00

All of the teams will play the same boards, but for security reasons, if one match is sufficiently behind that we have to start it later than the other one, we will not start the Vugraph broadcast until both matches have started play.

After a session, you can review the Vugraph action on our Web Vugraphs, which show each hand played with a link to bidding and play records. Take a look at the events currently available to see what we'll have for the 2012 USWBC. Web Vugraphs are posted within about half an hour of completion of the Vugraph show.

There are 7 teams in the Round Robin. Teams will be numbered in Seeding Point order.

ORDER OF PLAY ON JUNE 2ND IS OPPOSITE TO THAT ON

EVERY PLAYER ON EACH TEAM MUST PLAY AGAINST EACH OTHER TEAM

Lunch on Monday through Thursday from 2:30 - 5:30.


On Friday, Saturday & Sunday lunch will be a buffet in the hotel restaurant (Fresh 1800 on the lobby level).

In the Closed Room, something went amiss. One would expect this board to be flat. Sorkin opened 1D; Mandell responded 1H; Sorkin bid 1S; Mandell tried 1NT, and when Sorkin bid 2NT, Mandell, even with 9 HCP, chose to pass... likely not loving his singleton diamond and shaky heart stopper. Mohan led the spade ten, and Mandell collected the same 9 tricks as Pollack for a 10 IMP loss.

led the S9; Feldman won and led a small club; Pollack won his king and cashed the HA. He played a club to Feldman's ace, and the contract was down one in the first four tricks ... +100 to East/West.

In the other room, Mandell chose to complete his pattern. He bid 5C over 4S; Mohan doubled and Sorkin bid 5H. Mohan judged this a close call... it might make or it might not... That being the case, it seemed the better part of valor to take the favorable sacrifice in 5S.

It didn't matter. Mandell wasn't done. With his hand an open book, Jeffrey bid 6D to give Sorkin a choice of red suit slams. Sorkin chose diamonds and Smith happily doubled with his five card stack.

Smith led the C6 to Sorkin's king. Sorkin tried the DK, getting the bad news. Sorkin played a spade to the ace and finessed a heart to the jack. He ruffed a spade in dummy and floated the queen of hearts, ruffed by Smith. Smith played his C2 to the ace and the ten of hearts followed. Smith ruffed and switched to a trump. Sorkin pulled those remaining, and in the fullness of time, claimed ten tricks for down 2... 7 12 IMPs to Larsen





The auction was identical at both tables in the Lay/Schwartz match. Look only at the East hand. What would you lead?

Finkel made the "obvious" lead of top of a sequence. He started the jack of spades and declarer was able to discard two clubs and take the diamond finesse eventually losing three red tricks.

Griffey disdained the spade lead in favor of the unbid suit. He led the CT showing 0 or 2 higher and was rewarded handsomely for his decision. Dummy was rendered useless while the defense collected two clubs, two hearts and two diamonds. Down three was worth 14 IMPs to Lay.

Ron and Linda Smith reached 3NT on a standard auction. When Schwartz found the spade lead from AKx, the Smiths were doomed. Finkel was happy to encourage and East/West took the first five spade tricks.

At the other table, Schermer/Chambers diagnosed their spade weakness. After Chambers opened 1C, reversed into diamonds and supported hearts, Schermer chose the Moysian fit thinking partner was likely to hold a singleton spade. Griffey led the SJ to his partner's AK and Lay exited with a diamond. Declarer won the DA, trumped a spade with the H9. He played the HK and continued hearts. Lay covered the H7 with the eight and declarer was able to work out the minor suit distribution and take ten tricks . 10 IMPs to Schwartz
