

#### The Prez Says ...

Welcome back to Schaumburg, Illinois for the 2023 United States Bridge Championships. We will be selecting USA2 for the 2023 Bermuda Bowl, as well as USA1 & USA2 for the Venice Cup, the D'Orsi Senior Trophy and the Wuhan Cup Mixed Teams to be held in Marrakech, Morocco, 8/20 -9/2, 2023.

The Open commences tomorrow. All play will be face-to-face. The top two seeds, Nickell and Lebowitz, had automatic byes to the Round of 16, but with 14 teams entered, they received an additional bye to the QuarterFinal. The remaining 12 teams will play head-up knockout matches in the Round of 16.

Proof of vaccination is required.

As in 2022 when we determined Team Spector to be USA1 for the 2023 Bermuda Bowl, we will be using the LoveBridge software with two occupants per room during play. We will hopefully, however, be raising the bar by playing on ChromeBooks rather than Tablets.

Play Requirements: Each player must play 50% of the boards in each KO match in order to be eligible to continue on the team. See General Conditions of Contest Section XII for how to count boards and potential waiver of this requirement.

**Closed Notes**: Players may not consult their notes at any time during play, unless they are dummy.

Withdrawal: A player or team may withdraw at any time.


A player who has tested positive for Covid-19 will be allowed to continue to play, but will be required to play in a separate room. Both the Covid-positive player and his or her screenmate will be recorded on video during play.

While the USBF Board of Directors and the tournament organizers do their best to make this event the fairest Competition year after year, only YOU, the players, can uphold the high level of ethics, camaraderie and sportsmanship for which the USBF is known worldwide.

I know I will do my part to uphold these standards and I ask that each of you keep this in mind throughout the four events played here. Let the games begin!

#### Nail biting!

Do you want to be deeply involved? Choose the "Match view" at the starting page of your event. Your screen will be divided into four small screens – two of them showing the two tables of the match you choose, the other two having the scoresheet for your match and the current scores of the other matches. In the 2x2 view you can also personalize the content in all your windows. (The 2x2 view is not available on mobiles.)

#### Think together!

When watching a table, click on a name and choose "Kibitz". Instead of seeing all 4 hands, you will see what the player sees, and you can decide what you would do and see whether your chosen player agrees.

#### **More Information:**

Be well informed and tell your friends: while following the play, you can click many items. The image of the sticker with the number of the board (upper right) takes you to the results of the board, in the bottom right corner the arrow takes you to the scoresheet, DDS shows the double dummy analyses, beside that there is a button for the other table of the same match, at the top left corner you can see the bidding with alerts and the explanations (mouse over), the tricks already played, and the double dummy analysis for the available number of tricks with the par score.

#### **Navigation icons:**

While surfing here and there in the vugraph, or amongst the archive sessions, there are icons to help you. You can go back to the main page with the "house" or to the standings with the "scores". If you cannot see the icons, move your mouse, or touch your screen and they pop up immediately. There is also a built-in back button because the back button of your browser will always take you to the starting page. If this is not what you wanted, push next in your browser and you can continue where you were. **Replay**:

After the event you can find every board from every table easily. While replaying the hands, the only surprise can be the way "next board" button works. If you have arrived from a scoresheet, it navigates through the scoresheet. #### **VACCINATION REQUIRED:**

#### 2023 USBCs Hospitality

The **Bermuda Bowl**, **Venice Cup**, **d'Orsi Senior Bowl** and the **Wuhan Cup** are **for national teams**, respectively Open, Women, Seniors and Mixed, representing their countries, qualified from the 8 WBF Zonal Conferences.

The **World Transnational Open Teams** is **open**, without any qualification, to all teams, national or transnational, which want to participate, accordingly to the conditions of contest.

The **World Bridge Teams Championships**, the oldest WBF Championship, grew out of private initiatives principally by the late Norman Bach. The first world championship for the Bermuda Bowl was held in 1950, in Bermuda, 8 years before the World Bridge Federation itself was formed. After the first event of the series, the Bermuda Bowl developed into a regular challenge match between the USA and the winners of the European Championship, but in 1957 the contest widened to included teams representing other zones of the WBF.

In 1974, in Venice, Italy, a new event was launched, the Venice Cup. It started as a challenge match between women's teams from the USA and Italy (Europe 's representative) and today it is the equivalent of Bermuda Bowl for women, organized under the same laws and format.

A third series, the Senior Bowl, for senior players was added in 2001. Ernesto d'Orsi, Past President of the WBF and a member of the WBF Committee of Honor and the WBF Executive Council, presented the d'Orsi Seniors Trophy for the winners of this Championship at the World Teams Championships held in Brazil in 2009.

In March 2018 in Philadelphia the Executive Council added a fourth series for Mixed Teams starting from 2019 in Wuhan, China. This new event was named after the City of Wuhan which presented the prestigious trophy and provided, and will provide for the future editions, replicas for the winners.

#### Meet the Players

While other 7- and 8-year-olds were chasing fly balls or reading comic books, **Dennis and Jerry Clerkin** were playing bridge. "That was our recreation," says Dennis. "We started playing in our family when we were very young."

By the time they got to college, the brothers were reading books about bridge and "taking it very seriously," says Dennis, who is a year older than Jerry. The two began playing tournament bridge together over 35 years ago and have never looked back.

Those years of experience paid off in July 2010 when the Clerkin brothers, both Bloomington, IN residents, won the American Contract Bridge League's Grand National Teams Championship in New Orleans, a tournament in which they played 320 hands over five days.

As in all tournaments, during the final stages, screens were put up so that the players couldn't see their partners. No winks or tics or other discreet signals. That was just fine with the Clerkins. After all those years together, "We know each other so well," says Jerry, "that we don't need to see what's going on. When the screens go up, our edge goes up."

Even after all those years, the game is still challenging for the Clerkins. "Bridge is a game of not making mistakes," says Jerry. "You never reach perfection; you just strive for it. And there are always fascinating hands you haven't seen before."

When they aren't playing in tournaments the brothers teach bridge locally and, thanks to the Internet, play online. "People all over the world play online," says Jerry, recalling recent opponents from Turkey, Israel, and Portugal.

The brothers spend 15 to 18 weeks on the road every year. They've traveled to Europe half a dozen times and frequently to Mexico and Canada. In October, the Clerkins will be in Philadelphia for the world bridge championship, which will take place over 17 days.


But Bloomington has always been home. "When we started to play, people told us we should move to New York or Florida or California where most of the players are," Dennis recalled. "But Bloomington grounded us, and it was such a wonderful place to come home to."

#### Dan Morse 1938 - 2023

Dan Morse, a longstanding member of the USBF and past president of the ACBL, passed away suddenly on March 22, 2023.

Dan served as a delegate on the WBF Executive Council from 1996 to 2010, during which period he he was appointed to many different committees, including Finance, Laws, Master Points, Systems and, in later years, the WBF Senior Committee.



Dan was an excellent bridge player holding both WBF Open Life Master and WBF Senior Life Master titles, with an impressive list of WBF Championship results to his name. He was a well-known player in North America, where he won multiple titles.

Dan played year after year in USBF Bridge Championships from Open to Seniors. He partnered or teamed with outstanding players such as the late John Sutherlin and the late Gaylor Kasle. There is no doubt Dan would have been playing in this competition had he been able.

Dan is survived by his wife Barbara, his daughter Julie and his grandchildren McKenna and Noah. We send our sincere condolences to Dan's family and friends. He will be greatly missed in the world of bridge.

#### **ABOUT SCHAUMBURG:**

By the mid-nineteenth century, settlers first began to arrive from Germany and the eastern United States. Legend has it that the earliest settler was Trumball Kent from Oswego, New York. Kent, a "Yankee," as settlers from New England were called in the west, founded a settlement in 1835 not far from what is now called Olde Schaumburg Centre, formerly known as Sarah's Grove.

#### The Sunderlage Family

The first recorded settler of Schaumburg Township was German-born Johann Sunderlage. According to legend, Sunderlage was a member of a survey team that divided Cook County into townships around 1833. He liked the area so much that, upon completion of the project, he brought his family from Germany and settled in the area around 1836.

Sunderlage and his family occupied their land in the Township until the federal land sale of 1842 allowed them to purchase the property and obtain the deed. Sunderlage and Kent represented the predominant groups that settled Schaumburg Township in its early days. In 1840, 56 percent of the Township households originated from the eastern United States, while 28 percent were German-born. By the 1850s, the population mix had settled to 28 percent "Yankee" and 48 percent German.

#### **German Settlers**

By 1870, Schaumburg Township had become completely German. Land records show that all the property in the Township was owned by German immigrants or their descendants. This pattern emerged as many Yankee settlers continued to travel west for the promise of newly opened lands on the Great Plains. The land they occupied in Schaumburg was then purchased by German-born immigrants.

Schaumburg Township remained almost exclusively under German ownership until the Great Depression of the 1930s. The Depression caused the foreclosure on some German-owned farms which were then purchased by non-German individuals and companies. Nonetheless, German heritage remained important in the area. German was the first language of the majority of households until the 1950s. St. Peter Lutheran Church, the community's oldest church which was constructed in 1847, held services in German as late as 1970.

#### **Everything You Need to Know About LoveBridge and May Have Forgotten!**

Just a Disclaimer... Some of the below may be obsolete with the new Chromebooks!\*

\*Jan says, "The only real changes from the pads to the Chromebooks involve the keyboard being part of the Chromebook and the larger screen. Tthe biggest differences from previous years is each pair has its own time clock and will be shown their time remaining at the beginning of each hand, and a "STOP" button that a player can click on to stop play at both sides of the table when they are calling the director about something and it would be bad to have the other side of the table act before the director rules.

The directors have been testing the Chromebooks and advise that some of the screen display may be new to you! (see image at the bottom of page 29)

- What does that number in the upper left mean? You have unread chat message(s) and the strip at the left will be a sky blue until you read them (the number indicates how many unread messages are there). Click on the number/strip on the left to open/view. Click the X in top right corner to close. When all messages are read, the strip is grey.
- Why can't I chat to my partner? For security reasons, chat to partner is not available
  while cards for a new hand are on display. Since there is no "between round down time,"
  there is no real partner chat.

#### **Bidding**

- The system won't let me pass! If you have the level (1 through 7) highlighted, you will be unable to pass/double/redouble. If you try do so, the reset button will start flashing. Click the reset button to refresh.
- Where is the undo button? While there is no undo button, every call made is followed by a brief cancellation time period. A cancel button will appear immediately below the call selected in the top center portion of the screen. If you cancel within the time period, your bidding panel will reappear for you to select the intended call. If you do not cancel within the time period, summon a director (hit red TD whistle) to request an undo (second option).

#### Play

- 1. Why can't I click on a card? The default setting for LoveBridge is neither a tap/click nor a double tap/click. The default setting is a drag-and-drop motion where the player pulls a card to the gray box in the center of the screen and releases to play the card. If the "pulled" card is not the intended one, the player can drag it back to the hand and select another card. We recommend this setting while players are getting accustomed to the system. Players may change this setting to double tap/click if desired, but we strongly discourage single tap/click settings.
- 2. Whose turn is it? In the bidding or play of the hand, the player's direction letter (N S E W) will be a white letter inside of the circle with a pale blue outer circle when it is the player's turn. The auction is always displayed so that you are on the very right and your hand is at the bottom
- 3. How do I claim? During the play, you may click the larger blue box <u>below</u> the TD whistle to claim. If the claim button is grayed out (not available), you either already contributed a card to the current trick or you are dummy. (Note that you may not claim mid-trick. You may only claim between tricks.)
- **4.** How do I see the bidding once play has started? Per the Laws of Duplicate Bridge, a player is not entitled to the entire auction once they have played to trick 1. If you have not yet played to trick one, the auction will be in the lower left corner. Click on it to enlarge to the center area. Click the double gray arrows in the bottom right of the center area to send it back to the corner. Similarly, this is how a player may see the cards from the previous trick (prior to playing to current trick).

#### **TABLET GUIDE**







You don't have to shout for a director, just click the button and select a reason for call. The first 2 reasons stop play.

In case of a misclick, don't panic! Call TDs and they will try their best to help you.



You can set here the language, bidding and playing preferences anytime.

The system will remember your settings when you play next time.


If you misclick during the bidding, you have a few seconds to cancel bid. You can change this timeframe at Settings/Bid menu.


In addition, we will have some tablets set up in the bar area of the hotel lobby on Sunday afternoon & evening for you to practice on.

Here's what the tablet screen looks like right after you get your hand and before you have bid:



When you start to play on Monday, just call the director for any and all tablet-related issues.

\*\*\*One of the changes LoveBridge made for us for this year is a sub-menu that appears when you press the "Director" button so you can specify what the call is for:




If your call is for one of the top 2 reasons, play will stop at your table (including your partner's room). If your call is for one of the other reasons, someone (not necessarily a director) will come to your room to deal with the issue and play will continue at your table and your partner's table. Please select "Tech issue" for any tablet problems. Non-bridge is for an escort if you want to leave the room to smoke, a request for coffee, and things like that.

The CC button will open one PDF with the opponents' SSF and ACBL Convention card, as well as the ACBL Multi defense if your opponents are playing Multi The SSF and Convention card are as of the closing date for System submission. If you make any changes to your convention card after today, they will only be displayed if you tell me that you have done so, in which case I will update what is loaded into LoveBridge.

#### **Explanations**

Remember that even though you and your screenmate are in the same room so you can explain things verbally, you are still required to alert and/or explain your bids in writing on the tablet, so the opponent on the other side of the screen gets the information and we have a record of your alerts & explanations.


To make an explanation, you first need to access the keyboard. You do that when it is your turn to bid by clicking in the explanation box, which will open the keyboard for you. After you have made a bid, you can add an explanation by clicking on the envelope icon below the explanation box and then typing in the box.

To get to the Android keyboard, click on the picture of the keyboard at the left of the bridge keyboard. To get to other bridge keyboards, click on one of the other buttons to the left and right of the keyboard.

After you make a bid, you will have 3 seconds to cancel it. If you want to undo after the 3 seconds, you need to call the director and request an undo, which will only be granted in unusual situations.






When someone chats to you, their chat shows briefly in a bubble in the top left hand square:



#### Slam-Struck!




Ralph was dealer and he passed his 4 point hand. Stan could have opened a 1NT (10-12), but inferring that Nick held a good hand, he decided to bid a lead-directing 1S. He hoped this would mislead the opponents into thinking he did not hold a 10-12 NT.

Nick doubled and Suzi jumped to 4S.

This was passed around to Nick, who balanced with 4NT rather than reopening with double which his partner might pass. Ralph took an aggressive view. He bid 5S, saying pick a slam and suggesting that hearts was a playable spot. He could have bid 5NT to say pick a minor without heart tolerance.

Nick was happy to bid 6H. Suzi led the SA and Nick trumped in hand. A club was led to dummy's queen and the HJ was finessed followed by a heart to the queen. Nick led a diamond to the jack and Stan's king. Nick trumped the spade return and drew the last trump. When clubs broke 3-3, Nick took twelve tricks. Well done with Nickell/Katz's combined 23 HCP. Obviously no one steals from Ralph and Nick!

Ralph jumped to 5NT.

Nickell decided a grand was too rich for his blood and bid 6H, since he feared 6C could create confusion.

When trumps divided evenly, Katz finessed for the CK and took all 13 tricks.

And this time, Katz/Nickell held only a combined 21 HCP!

Marty Bergen said it right, "Points! Shmoints!"
