The Prez Says ...

Welcome back to Schaumburg, Illinois, home of the 2026 United States Bridge Championships. Please be advised: **There have been changes to some of rules. In the Open, there will be no byes based on last year’s performance.**

In the Mixed, a team that qualifies for the Wuhan Cup and becomes reduced to 3 of 4, or 4 of 6 original qualifiers will continue to be eligible to compete in the World Championship, even if the reduced team does not have 2 men and 2 women. The team will be required to add players so the ultimate World Championship team does have 3 men and 3 women.

The 2026 Open and Mixed USBCs will select 1 team for the 2027 Bermuda Bowl (Open) and 1 team for the 2027 Wuhan Cup (Mixed). The U.S.A. is entitled to two teams in each division of the World Bridge Team Championships; One team for each will be qualified this year and one team for each plus 2 teams for the Seniors and Women’s will be qualified in the 2027 USBCs.

Events will be held face to face in Schaumburg from the Round of 16 forward. With more than 16 teams entered (and there are 19 entered in the Open), there will be an online Round Robin on RealBridge to reduce the field to 16 teams for face to face play. Some high seeds will be exempt.

The first face to face stage of each event will be a 3 day Round Robin to select 8 teams for the Quarterfinal. The Quarterfinal, Semifinal, and Final will feature 2 day 120 board KO matches.

The 2026 F2F Open USBC will start on Monday, April 13th and end on Tuesday, April 21st. The 2026 Mixed USBC will start on Wednesday, April 22nd and end on Thursday, April 30th.

As in the past, this event will be played using LoveBridge software on ChromeBooks in individual rooms at the Hyatt Hotel with two players (one from each team) in each room.

The USBF Board of Directors, Advisors and the Tournament Committee do their best to ensure the fairest Competition on the planet. WE, the players, do our part by upholding the high level of ethics, camaraderie and sportsmanship for which the USBF is known worldwide. Good luck all! Let the games begin! And, most importantly, respect one another and have fun!

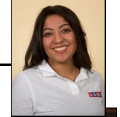

Kibitzing Schedule (EDT) For all KO days of the 2026 USBCs, kibitzing times will be :

Segment 1: 11:30 am EDT

Segment 2: 1:45 pm EDT

Segment 3: 5:00 pm EDT

Segment 4: 7:15 pm EDT

For Round Robin days, each kibitzing segment will start 30 minutes after play starts.

To view a Single Table, click on the blue arrow on the scores page. It provides the largest view of one table, with buttons to get to other information.

Match View will show the two tables of a match side by side on your screen;

Split View will give you 4 panes of your window and you can put whatever you want in each of them to watch 2 side-by-side matches at once, or one match and the scores of others.

Click on Buttons to get interesting information:

- The image of the sticker with the number of the board (upper right) takes you to the results of the board;
- the arrow in the bottom right corner takes you to the scoresheet
- the DDS shows the double dummy analyses. Besides that there is a button for the other table of the same match,
- at the top left corner you can see the bidding with alerts and the explanations (mouse over), the tricks already played, and the double dummy analysis for the available number of tricks with the par score.
- **NEW THIS YEAR:** Written commentary will show in a large area on the left of the screen in Single Table view and at the top of the screen in Match View. If you are interesting in providing written commentary, please email Jan and she will get you authorized.

Navigation icons:

While surfing here and there in the vugraph, or amongst the archive sessions, there are icons to help you. You can always go back to the main page with the “house” or to the standings with the “scores”. There is also a built-in back button because the back button of your browser will always take you to the starting page. If this is not what you wanted, push next in your browser and you can continue where you were.

LOVEBRIDGE PRACTICE

There will be a LoveBridge practice session on Sunday, April 12 from 5-7 pm in room 1321. Players are welcome to attend. Whether you've played on LoveBridge before and just want a quick review, or are new to LoveBridge and want to become familiar with the interface, this is recommended for your comfort using this platform.



MASSAGES

Breakfast: From 8:00-10:00 am. There will be the usual breakfast food: cereal, bagels, toast, salmon, fruit, juice, coffee and tea. Keurig coffee will be available in the hospitality suite. So long as the suite doesn't become too crowded, you are welcome to eat there.

Lunch: On the first three days of the Open and Mixed USBCs we will be serving a buffet lunch in the hotel restaurant. The hotel is unwilling to have people take food out of the restaurant to eat someplace else. Lunch will be served from 12:30-2:30. The second Round Robin match each day is scheduled to end at 1:10 and the third match starts at 2:30.

After the first 3 days of each event, lunch will be available in the hospitality suite from 1:45-3:45. There will be a main dish (sandwiches, chicken, main dish salads, pizza) as well as tuna salad, green salad, cheese, fruit, berries, cookies or other desserts.

There is a water dispenser in the hospitality suite. Please bring a water bottle to use. Soft drinks will be available in refrigerators. As with breakfast, you are welcome to eat in the hospitality suite unless it is too crowded.

After three days of near continuous play, the 3rd Annual WBF Women's Online Transnational Teams finished on March 29th.

Four women from Norway playing under the name, **Viking Queens: Virginia Chediak, Torild Heskje, Ranja Sivertsvik, Gunn Tove Vist**, averaged 14.85 VP from their 13 matches and emerged as the winners. Team **Thunder**, an alliance between the USA and Israel (**Adi Asulin, Nancy Katz, Hila Levy, Dana Tal, Noga Tal and Migry Zur Campanile**) averaged 14.65 to finish in second place. E18 Norway (**Aase Birbakken, Siri Hove Bjerger, Marianne Homme, Anja Prestvik**), with an average of 14.33 VP finished third. Congrats to all!

Great prizes encouraged the 65 teams to enter the event. The winning team received a berth in the upcoming Women's event at the World Championships in Poland in August.

Mark Horton produced a Daily Online Bulletin, elevating the competition and bringing both Women's Bridge and the World Bridge Federation to the forefront. Here is a hand from the final bulletin involving two US women players: Nancy Katz and Migry Zur Campanile from team Thunder:

Meet the Players



Joe Grue grew up in Minnesota. He now lives in New York City and works as a full time bridge professional. Joe has had great success with many different partners. He won the Junior World Championships with John Kranyak in 2001, 2005 and 2006. He won the Reisinger, North American Swiss and Vanderbilt with Curtis Cheek. Since then he & Brad Moss have won the Spingold, Vanderbilt, Bermuda Bowl and two USBCs, as well as finishing second in the World Open Pairs. Joe won the Blue Ribbon Pairs in 2015, 2016 and 2018 and finished second in 2017. He won the 2018 Barry Crane top 500, winning a record total of 3676 masterpoints.

Joe comes from a bridge-playing family still in Minnesota who are proud of his accomplishments and cheer him on via VuGraph.

Brad Moss was born in 1971 in New York City. His parents, Mike Moss and Gail Greenberg, are well known among bridge players for their expertise. His sister, Jill Levin, is also a bridge star. Brad was named the ACBL King of Bridge at the age of 18. Two years later, he became the youngest player to win the New York Player of the Year title. In 1991, he just missed out on a medal at the World Junior Teams in Ann Arbor, Michigan, finishing fourth, and won his first National title - the Master Mixed Teams. In 1993, he added to his tally by winning the Grand National Teams and the Life Masters Open Pairs.

His successful partnership with Fred Gitelman included wins in the 1998 NABC Board-a-Match Teams, a third in the 1998 Cavendish Invitational Pairs, first in the 2005 & 2010 Spingolds, the 2010 Roth Open Swiss, the 2012 Jacoby Open Swiss, the Bronze medal in the 2005 Bermuda Bowl and gold in the 2010 Rosenblum teams.

With Joe Grue he finished second in the 2013 Spingold (tied at the end of regulation play) and won the 2016 Spingold and 2017 Bermuda Bowl.

Grue and Moss are playing as partners in this USBC as members of team Fleisher.

ABOUT SCHAUMBURG:

Located just 30 miles outside Chicago and about 11 miles west of O'Hare International Airport, Schaumburg is arguably a premier suburban business destination in Illinois. In the past 60 years, Schaumburg has transformed from a small farming community into a thriving economic center that is home to more business in Illinois than any other community outside of Chicago. The village's businesses provide support to the community's 78,000 residents, 80,000 employees and the northwest suburbs.

Residents and visitors can attend a concert or the Farmers Market in the Town Square, take in theater and other shows at the Al Larson Prairie Center for the Arts, visit the Trickster Cultural Center (Native-owned and operated art gallery), discover family fun at Legoland Discovery Center, or enjoy independent league baseball at Wintrust Field. And, the Schaumburg Township District Library is the second-largest public library in Illinois, with more than one million visitors each year.

History

The Village of Schaumburg was incorporated on March 7, 1956, but the heritage of Schaumburg dates back to the much earlier times when the first inhabitants of the area were members of the Sauk, Fox, Pottawatomie, and Kickapoo Indian tribes. Schaumburg's earliest residents were primarily German-speaking immigrants and their days consisted of farming, community and family. In many ways that remains true today, although now Schaumburg is a mecca of commercial activity.

The First Settlers

By the mid-nineteenth century, settlers first began to arrive from Germany and the eastern United States. Legend has it that the earliest settler was Trumbull Kent from Oswego, New York. Kent, a "Yankee," as settlers from New England were called in the west, founded a settlement in 1835 not far from what is now called Olde Schaumburg Centre, formerly known as Sarah's Grove.

The Sunderlage Family

The first recorded settler of Schaumburg Township was German-born Johann Sunderlage. According to legend, Sunderlage was a member of a survey team that divided Cook County into townships around 1833. He liked the area so much that, upon completion of the project, he brought his family from Germany and settled in the area around 1836.

Sunderlage and his family occupied their land in the Township until the federal land sale of 1842 allowed them to purchase the property and obtain the deed. Sunderlage and Kent represented the predominant groups that settled Schaumburg Township in its early days. In 1840, 56 percent of the Township households originated from the eastern United States, while 28 percent were German-born. By the 1850s, the population mix had settled to 28 percent "Yankee" and 48 percent German.

German Settlers

By 1870, Schaumburg Township had become completely German. Land records show that all the property in the Township was owned by German immigrants or their descendants. This pattern emerged as many Yankee settlers continued to travel west for the promise of newly opened lands on the Great Plains. The land they occupied in Schaumburg was then purchased by German-born immigrants.

Schaumburg Township remained almost exclusively under German ownership until the Great Depression of the 1930s. The Depression caused the foreclosure on some German-owned farms which were then purchased by non-German individuals and companies. Nonetheless, German heritage remained important in the area. German was the first language of the majority of households until the 1950s. St. Peter Lutheran Church, the community's oldest church which was constructed in 1847, held services in German as late as 1970.

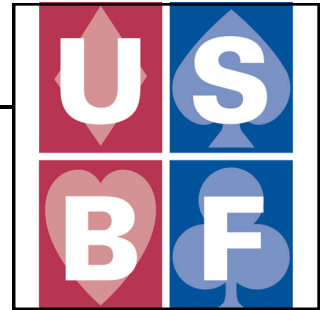

Player Event Preferences!

Everything You Need to Know About LoveBridge and May Have Forgotten!

Just a Disclaimer... Some of the below may be obsolete with the new Chromebooks!*

*Jan says, "The only real changes from the pads to the Chromebooks involve the keyboard being part of the Chromebook and the larger screen. The biggest differences from previous years is each pair has its own time clock and will be shown their time remaining at the beginning of each hand, and a "STOP" button that a player can click on to stop play at both sides of the table when they are calling the director about something and it would be bad to have the other side of the table act before the director rules.

The directors have tested the Chromebooks and advise that some of the screen display may be new to you!

- **What does that number in the upper left mean?** You have unread chat message(s) and the strip at the left will be a sky blue until you read them (the number indicates how many unread messages are there). Click on the number/strip on the left to open/view. Click the X in top right corner to close. When all messages are read, the strip is grey.
- **Why can't I chat to my partner?** For security reasons, chat to partner is not available while cards for a new hand are on display. Since there is no "between round down time," there is no real partner chat.

Bidding

- **The system won't let me pass!** If you have the level (1 through 7) highlighted, you will be unable to pass/double/redouble. If you try do so, the reset button will start flashing. Click the reset button to refresh.
- **Where is the undo button?** While there is no undo button, every call made is followed by a brief cancellation time period. A **cancel** button will appear immediately below the call selected in the top center portion of the screen. If you cancel within the time period, your bidding panel will reappear for you to select the intended call. If you do not cancel within the time period, summon a director (hit red TD whistle) to request an undo (second option).

Play

1. **Why can't I click on a card?** The default setting for LoveBridge is neither a tap/click nor a double tap/click. The default setting is a drag-and-drop motion where the player pulls a card to the gray box in the center of the screen and releases to play the card. If the "pulled" card is not the intended one, the player can drag it back to the hand and select another card. **We recommend this setting while players are getting accustomed to the system.** Players may change this setting to double tap/click if desired, but we strongly discourage single tap/click settings.
2. **Whose turn is it?** In the bidding or play of the hand, the player's direction letter (N S E W) will be a white letter inside of the circle with a pale blue outer circle when it is the player's turn. The auction is always displayed so that you are on the very right and your hand is at the bottom.
3. **How do I claim?** During the play, you may click the larger blue box below the TD whistle to claim. If the claim button is grayed out (not available), you either already contributed a card to the current trick or you are dummy. (Note that you may not claim mid-trick. You may only claim between tricks.)
4. **How do I see the bidding once play has started?** Per the Laws of Duplicate Bridge, a player is not entitled to the entire auction once they have played to trick 1. If you have not yet played to trick one, the auction will be in the lower left corner. Click on it to enlarge to the center area. Click the double gray arrows in the bottom right of the center area to send it back to the corner. Similarly, this is how a player may see the cards from the previous trick (prior to playing to current trick).

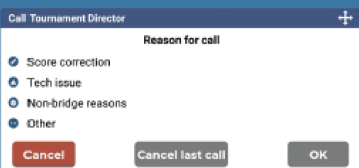

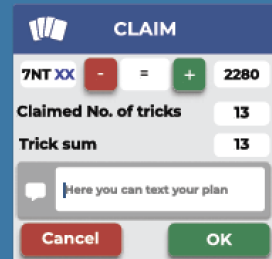

You can tap on a bid to alert your calls or ask for information. You can even give written explanation.



When you place a bid, there is a short time period, when you can take it back with the cancel button, and the other players will not notice.

You can also confirm your bid, if you don't want to wait until the time is over.

EXPLANATION & CHAT GUIDE

The logic of alerts and explanations in the LoveBridge system can work multiple ways. You will use it **with self alert and screened tables**. You only alert your own calls. Both opponents can ask for more information, and they will always know the same details about bids.

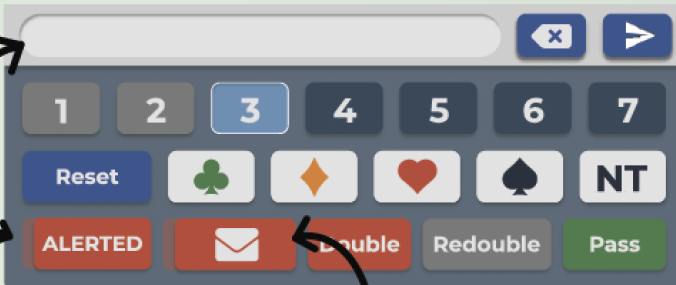
Alerting

When you want to alert your call, you have multiple options:

You can **tap in the input field** and write your explanation here.

You can **tap on the alert button** so your opponent knows it's artificial.

You can **tap the envelope button** and, after placing your call, the bridge keyboard will pop up. Here you can type your explanation. Note: Your call will be alerted as well.

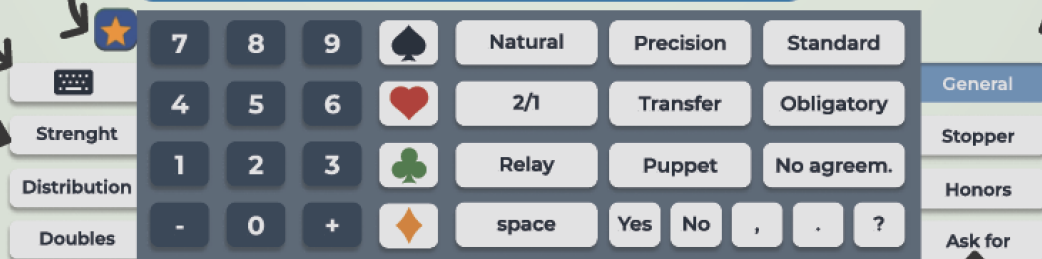


Bridge keyboard

Common bridge expressions are organized in seven categories to help you type bridge related messages with only a few taps.

You can type any other message using a traditional keyboard.

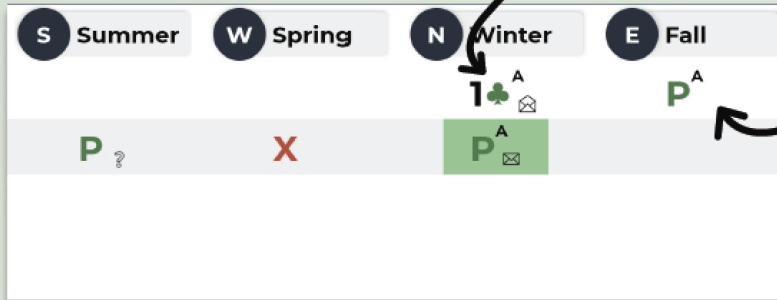
Your favorite explanations will be saved here.

Bidding Panel

The closed envelope shows that you have an **unread message**.



You can always give additional information by tapping on your bid. Make sure that your explanation contains complete information about a specific call.

You can ask for additional information by sending a question mark. You can ask specific questions using the chat. (More about the chat on the next page.)

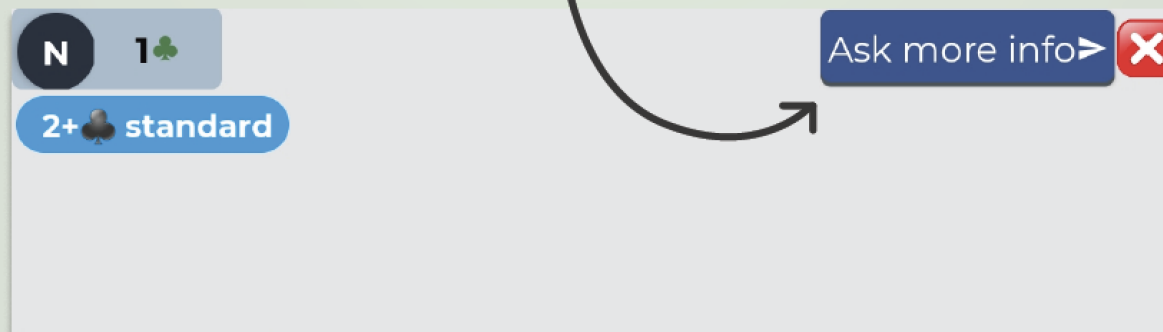
When you send an explanation, both of your opponents will receive it. Both opponents can ask for more information.

Received Explanations

You will see a pop up notification about new explanations.

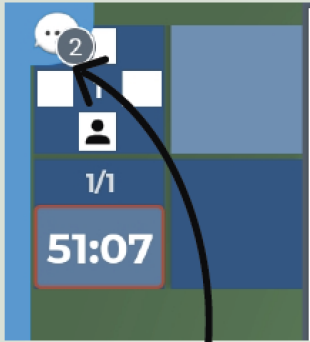
You can ask for further information by simply tapping the 'Ask more info' button.

When you read the explanation, you can **close the window** with the X button.



Chat

You can use the chat to send private messages to your opponents, or you can chat with the entire table.



You can find the chat in the top left corner of the screen. You can open it by tapping the chat bar.



You can only send private messages to your partner when you are currently not playing any boards.

Android Keyboard

When writing an explanation, you can press the “done” button to switch back to the bridge keyboard.



To write a question mark: You can use the shift button or a long press on the question mark or switch to the symbol keyboard.

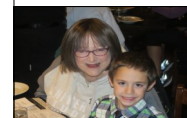

Perhaps not ideal as neither the Woolsey team nor the Zheng team Q'ed, but interesting points nonetheless... Both Wests led a 4th best H2 against 3N. Kit Woolsey ducked the first heart to the 9 and won the East's Q lead (not wanting to duck and have them switch to a diamond). If hearts are 4-4 as they appear to be, running the clubs will yield 9 tricks (drive out DA). How best to play the clubs is unclear with only one later entry to the dummy. If you cash the A then finesse, you won't be able to pick up Q9xx onside (3 holdings), while running the T immediately will pick up Q9xx onside, but lose to stiff Q in either hand (though if stiff Q onside, can later hope to run the spades for 9 tricks). Kit led the club 10 and successfully ran the clubs. East threw two spades, so Kit could safely run them for 11 tricks (note that if E had kept Qxx of spades, Kit would likely have led a diamond to set up his 9th trick rather than risk setting up the spade Q for the defense's 5 trick).

At the other table E returned a low heart at trick 2 to the K and ducked. After winning the 3rd heart, declarer cashed the CA and the SAK. Superficially this gave declarer a chance to run spades or clubs (if the spade Q drops declarer can eventually drive out the DA and avoid the club finesse), however, when the spade Q didn't drop this set up the 5th defensive trick, and declarer went down 1 even when the clubs ran.

As a final note on the club suit, if we assume that East would prefer to lead a 5 card diamond suit over a 4 card heart suit, then East will only have a stiff club with 4-4-4-1 or with 5 spades, so that might shift the odds to a different approach that improves on the losing line: cash one high club, then lead a high diamond to set up the 9th trick. After the opponents take their hearts, declarer can play AK of spades. If the Q drops, they have 9 tricks, and if not they can try to run the clubs. This risks extra under-tricks as East/West can set up diamond tricks to cash if the club finesse loses (possibly resulting in going down 4).
